### WHO WE ARE

PotashCorp is the world's largest fertilizer enterprise by capacity producing the three primary plant nutrients – potash, phosphate and nitrogen. We are a leading supplier of fertilizer, animal feed and industrial products. With operations and business interests in seven countries, we are a global company and a key player in meeting the growing challenge to feed the world.

PCS Phosphate Company Inc.'s Weeping Water plant (PotashCorp Weeping Water) is one of five PotashCorp operations that produces animal feed products. Rich in limestone reserves, the Weeping Water facility has been operating since the 1920s. We are a proud member of the Weeping Water community, employing 36 people and supporting the region through investment and education.

### WHAT WE DO

PotashCorp's Weeping Water plant produces phosphate products that are used as supplements in animal feed blends. We mine roughly 125,000 tonnes of limestone every year and use the material to make dical, monocal, and coarse monocal.

### HOW WE DO IT

Safety of our people and protection of the environment are core values at Weeping Water – and at all PotashCorp operations – so when our team comes to work they do it in a safe environment. Our facility uses specialized equipment and complex methods to create these products for customers in the feed sector. We ship our products by rail, road and water.

### PotashCorp's Performance

**Safety:** The safety of our people always comes first at PotashCorp. At Weeping Water, we're committed to creating a culture that cares about taking safety seriously and personally. Nothing is more important to the company than returning our people home safely at the end of each day.

In 2010 we:

- Celebrated six years without a lost-time injury and four years without a recordable injury
- Achieved zero contractor injuries
- Continued installing work platforms and replacing fixed ladders with stairs

**Community:** At PotashCorp, we want to enhance the well-being of the communities in which we live and work. In the Weeping Water region, our operation contributes significant dollars to local organizations and causes and commits to a local purchasing policy.

In 2010 we:

- Donated more than \$63,000 to local organizations and groups
- Contributed in-kind goods and services and volunteer support worth more than \$9,000 to various organizations
- Spent \$5.4 million on local purchasing

**Environment:** Our company strives to achieve no damage to the environment at all of our operations. We know our role as an environmental steward is important. We work every day to protect the land, water and air surrounding our facility.

In 2010 we:

- Continued to install energy-efficient lights and occupancy sensors to reduce energy use
- Maintained our recycling program and improved employee awareness
- Spent more than \$800,000 on environmental programs and initiatives

## Did You Know?

PotashCorp Weeping Water hosted laboratory best practice training for our feed plant employees in 2010 and received Safe Feed/Safe Food recertification from the American Feed Industry Association.

One facility employee became certified in the Operation Lifesaver Program and delivered several safety presentations on site and in the community, while three more employees attended Mine Safety Health Association (MSHA) training – raising our operation's number of certified MSHA instructors on site to nine in 2010.

Our partnerships with several local schools continued in 2010. We helped with numerous school projects including the honor choir, 5th Grade science fair, an exchange student visit to Washington, D.C., basketball, cheerleading, dance team, football, prom activities, faculty dinner and fundraising.

In 2010, we supported our community by contributing to a new community building which is used for a senior center, city library and community events.

Weeping Water received a number of safety awards, including the 2010 MSHA Sentinels of Safety Award for underground mines for the sixth straight year for achieving more than 9,100 employee hours worked without a lost-time injury and the mill for the third year in a row for achieving more than 50,600 employee hours worked without a lost-time injury.
